PUBLIC QUESTION TO BE VOTED UPON

PROPOSAL

The Board of Education of the Township of Washington in the County of Morris, New Jersey is hereby authorized to (a) undertake a school facilities project consisting of heating, ventilation improvements including air-conditioning and humidity control measures, electrical service upgrades and partial roof replacement at Old Farmers Road Elementary School and partial roof replacement at Long Valley Middle School and (b) expend and issue school bonds in an amount up to \$4,174,248 on such projects. The State has agreed to provide debt service aid in the amount of 40% of the "final eligible costs" of the school facilities project. All of the project costs are final eligible costs. The local shares of the projects may be transferred amongst the projects.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

THE PROJECTS: In order to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment and provide for facilities infrastructure needs, the Board is seeking to undertake:

- heating, ventilation improvements including air-conditioning and humidity control measures, electrical service upgrades and partial roof replacement at Old Farmers Road Elementary School and
- partial roof replacement at Long Valley Middle School.

The projects will be undertaken at a cost not to exceed \$4,174,248 which will be funded through the issuance of a short term bond/note.

STATE/LOCAL FUNDING FOR THE PROJECTS

The State has agreed to contribute about \$1.67 million (40%) towards the costs of the \$4.17 million project. All costs of the projects are available for the highest level of State funding. The State funding will be in the form of debt service aid. The State funding is only available if the Proposal is approved.

The Board expects to fund its local share of the project, about \$2.5 million (60%), with monies that will be available in the Capital Reserve Account. Therefore, it is anticipated that no new tax dollars will be raised to pay for the projects.
