1	Press the button to the right of the candidate of your choice; a green "X" will appear next to your selection.	
2	To change a selection, press the button 🔲 again. The green "X" will disappear and you may make a new selection.	
3	If you wish to cast a WRITE-IN vote (you may not write-in any name that is printed on the ballot for the same office), go to the WRITE-IN column and press the button next to WRITE-IN across from the office you wish to write-in. A blinking green "X" will appear. Using the alphabetical keyboard below, enter the name of the person of your choice, one letter at a time. To make a space between first and middle name or initial and last name use the arrow pointing to the right on the keyboard. To make a correction, use the arrow pointing to the left. The name you ENTER will appear in the display to the left of the keyboard. When you have entered the whole name, proof it, then press the enter button on the keyboard. Your choice is recorded and removed from the display. Do not press the cast vote button until all other choices are complete. (Each write-in is a separate entry.)	
	<u>WARNING!</u> An improperly cast write-in vote will be void. Be sure that your write-in vote is cast in the WRITE-IN column on the same line as the office for which you are casting the write-in vote.	
4	To vote on the PUBLIC QUESTIONS press the button to the right of the word "YES" or "NO"; a green "X" will appear next to your selection.	
5	After ALL selections have been made, press the RED CAST VOTE BUTTON located in the lower right corner. This electronically records all of your votes.
