IMPORTANT! ATTENTION VOTERS! NEW IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING IS AN OPTION - STARTS SAT. OCT 28 THRU SUN. NOV 5

As a result of legislation enacted into law, the State of New Jersey will be offering in-person early voting on a machine during a nine day period. In addition to providing early voting, registered voters will continue to have the option of voting by mail or in-person at their polling place on Election Day. There will be 8 early voting sites throughout Morris County. New electronic poll books will be used to sign-in voters. Poll workers will be available to assist all voters in using these new devices. The early voting locations are listed below. Hours for early voting are Monday-Saturday, 10am to 8pm and Sunday 10am to 6pm. It doesn't matter where you live in Morris County - registered voters can go to any of the 8 sites and conveniently cast your ballot on a voting machine.

EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

- Please read through the instructions completely. Insert the ballot card into the card slot on the right of the device with the cut corner of the card facing the upper right.
- Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn Green. To change your selection, touch the Green Box again and it will re-select that candidate. You may make a new selection.
- To write-in a candidate, select the Write-In box, in the last column, across from the office you wish to write-in. A keyboard will appear. Type in the first and last name of the person of your choice. Touch "Accept". Your write-in choice will appear on the ballot.
- When you have completed voting and verified your selections, touch the Green "Print Ballot" button on the lower right side of the screen. A confirmation message will first be displayed to "Return to Ballot" or "Print".
 - To make any changes before printing the voter paper audit trail, touch "Return to Ballot".
 - To proceed with printing the voter paper Ballot, touch "Print". This will print the candidates you have selected on the Ballot card and display it in the printer window for your review.
 - Review the ballot card to ensure it represents your selections accurately. Then touch the "Cast" button only if what is displayed on the Ballot card accurately reflects your choices.
 - If changes need to be made after printing the Ballot card, touch the "Quit" button to cancel the voting session. A poll worker will be signaled to assist you. You must return your spoiled Ballot card folded to the poll worker in order to receive a new Ballot activation card to start the voting process over.

PUBLIC QUESTIONS TO BE VOTED UPON	
<p>Question #1</p> <p>Separate Proposal # 1 is for construction costs to install security vestibules at the main entrance of each of the six district schools in the 2023/2024 school year and ongoing building and security costs and enhancements, including the maintenance of surveillance systems, the employment of security personnel, the maintenance of cyber security software, and the fortification of the building perimeters at all six schools, at a cost of \$950,000. Voter approval of this proposal will represent a permanent increase in the tax levy of 1.23%.</p> <p>Supporting Statement:</p> <p>Separate Proposal # 1 is for the construction costs to install security vestibules at the main entrance of each of the six district schools in the 2023/2024 school year. In the subsequent years, the funds will be used for ongoing security costs and enhancements, including the maintenance of surveillance systems, the employment of security personnel, the maintenance of cyber security software, and the fortification of the building perimeters at all six schools, at a cost of \$850,000 per year. 1.23% meaning that the tax levy will increase by 1.23% and the actual dollar amount of that increase will become part of the base budget moving forward.</p> <p>YES NO</p>	<p>Question #2</p> <p>Separate Proposal # 2 is for the cost of health benefits for a portion of the paraprofessional staff employed in each school year at a cost of \$900,000. Voter approval of this proposal will represent a permanent increase in the tax levy of 1.30%.</p> <p>Supporting Statement:</p> <p>Separate Proposal # 2 will provide the funds to offer a portion of the paraprofessional staff health benefits as part of their employment contract. This will enhance the district's ability to recruit and retain paraprofessional staff members through a compensation package that is competitive with neighboring districts. Paraprofessional staff members support students receiving special education services throughout the district. Voter approval of this proposal will represent a permanent increase in the tax levy of 1.30%, meaning that the tax levy will increase by 1.30% and the dollar amount of that increase will become part of the base budget moving forward.</p> <p>YES NO</p>
