INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

- Please read through the instructions completely. Insert the ballot card into the card slot on the right of the device with the cut corner of the card facing the upper right.
- Touch candidate names to make your selections. Your selection will turn **Green**. To change your selection, touch the **Green Box** again and it will de-select that candidate. You may make a new selection.
- To write-in a candidate, select the **Write-In box**, in the last column, across from the office you wish to write-in. A keyboard will appear. Type in the first and last name of the person of your choice. Touch **"Accept"**. Your write-in choice will appear on the ballot.
- When you have completed voting and verified your selections, touch the **Green "Print Ballot"** button on the lower right side of the screen. A confirmation message will first be displayed to **"Return to Ballot"** or **"Print"**.
 - To make any changes before printing the voter paper audit trail, touch **"Return to Ballot"**.
 - To proceed with printing the voter paper Ballot, touch **"Print"**. This will print the candidates you have selected on the Ballot card and display it in the printer window for your review.
 - Review the Ballot card to ensure it represents your selections accurately. Then touch the **"Cast"** button only if what is displayed on the Ballot card accurately reflects your choices.
 - If changes need to be made after printing the Ballot card, touch the **"Quit"** button to cancel the voting session. A poll worker will be signaled to assist you. You must return your spoiled Ballot card folded to the poll worker in order to receive a new Ballot activation card to start the voting process over.

Stephens Elementary School; (b) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, and to remove and to replace the roof at Mountain View Elementary School; (c) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, and to construct an addition at Sandshore Elementary School; (d) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, and to construct an addition at Tinc Road Elementary School; (e) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, and to construct an addition at Mount Olive Middle School; (f) to undertake various renovations, improvements, alterations and upgrades, various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, and to undertake paving and parking lot upgrades at Mount Olive High School; (g) to appropriate \$52,802,178 for such improvements; and (h) to issue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$52,802,178. <p>EXPLANATORY STATEMENT</p> <p>At this election, the voters of the school district are being asked to consider Bond Proposal Questions No. 1 and No. 2. As set forth above, Bond Proposal Question No. 2 will only go into effect if Bond Proposal Question No. 1 is also approved by the voters at this election.</p> <p>If Bond Proposal Questions No. 1 and No. 2 are approved by the voters at this election, the Board of Education will be authorized: (a) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, and to remove and to replace the roof at Chester M. Stephens Elementary School; (b) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, and to remove and to replace the roof at Mountain View Elementary School; (c) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, and to construct an addition at Sandshore Elementary School; (d) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, and to construct an addition at Tinc Road Elementary School; (e) to undertake various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, to construct an addition, and to undertake the demolition of and the construction of a new Transportation Maintenance Building and Transportation Office Facility all at Mount Olive Middle School; and (f) to undertake various renovations, improvements, alterations and upgrades, various HVAC improvements, alterations, and upgrades, to remove and to replace the roof, to construct an addition, and to undertake paving and parking lot upgrades at Mount Olive High School. Stephens Elementary School, \$5,633,880 for Mountain View Elementary School, \$3,467,880 for Sandshore Elementary School, \$1,026,000 for Tinc Road Elementary School, \$8,030,160 for Mount Olive Middle School, and \$11,556,351 for Mount Olive High School). The projects include \$6,180,460 (consisting of \$0 for Chester M. Stephens Elementary School, \$0 for Mountain View Elementary School, \$1,201,200 for Sandshore Elementary School, \$1,201,200 for Tinc Road Elementary School, \$2,920,060 for Mount Olive Middle School, and \$858,000 for Mount Olive High School) for school facility construction elements in addition to the facilities efficiency standards developed by the Commissioner of Education or not otherwise eligible for State support pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7G-5(g). The State debt service aid percentage will equal 40% of the annual debt service due with respect to the final eligible costs of the projects.
